Scam Alert!

BRINGS
UNWANTED VISITORS TO CENTRAL
ILLINOIS

Spring brings warm temperatures, blooming flowers and itinerant workers and sales people who move through neighborhoods offering a variety of services. Calls from consumers tell us that peddlers of magazine subscriptions, bulk frozen meat and driveway sealing services, are already making the rounds this year. The Better Business Bureau (BBB) suggests that consumers first carefully conduct research on the contractor's company before hiring him or her.

Bonnie Bakin, CEO of the BBB Serving Central Illinois, points out that not all itinerant workers are dishonest. "Many of these folks are hard-working individuals who are trying to make an honest living," she said. "However, there are some shady characters in the bunch that we all should be on the lookout for."

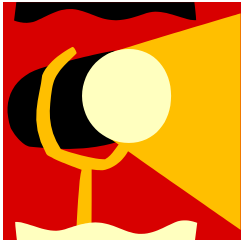
BBB recommends being cautious of a door-to-door salespeople or itinerant workers if they:

- **Use high-pressure sales tactics.** A reputable seller will give you time to think through the deal and make an appointment to return at a later date.
- **Offer a deal that sounds too good to be true.** The adage holds true that you get what you pay for and many people have been quickly disappointed when the products didn't live up to the hype or the company did a shoddy job.
- **Can't or won't provide you with personal identification or contact information for the company they represent.** Any legitimate salesperson will be able to provide you

with positive identification for both themselves and their company.

- **Fail to follow federal law.** Federal law requires that if you purchase more than \$25 in goods, the salesperson must inform you of your rights to cancel within three business days.

BBB WARNS CENTRAL ILLINOIS OF NEW VISHING SCAM: Within minutes, two senior citizen women from Peoria received the same phone call. The call appears as "Out of Area" or "701-509-8703" on caller ID's. When answered, the automated voice informs the consumer that their MasterCard credit card has been frozen or restricted and that it can be restored to normal if the consumer punches in their 13-digit credit card number. BBB reports when the number is dialed, there is no answer, however an automated message asks for the consumer's credit card number. BBB Investigators determined the out of area number is actually a cell phone number in North Dakota and that many consumers across the US have received the same type of call. Consumers who called the BBB report the automated response is from a local bank or credit union, while others state the recording indicates that due to a mishap, the credit card has been cancelled. Every caller was told in order to reactivate their card they would need to enter in the card number. At no time does the recording provide specific information about the consumer or identifiable information of the company. Identity thieves impersonate trustworthy sources or create fictitious reasons to contact consumers to try to get personal information -- such as Social Security numbers, birthdates, passwords, credit card or bank account information. Phishing is conducted by electronic communication, usually e-mail. Vishing is a form of phishing conducted by phone. The name comes from Voice Over Internet Protocol phishing. Smishing is a form of phishing conducted by text message. The name comes from Short Message Service phishing. **Red Flags:** Consumer is contacted saying there is a problem with an account and is asked for personal or financial information. Consumer feels pressured to respond urgently, give personal information, or make a purchase or donation.
